We know it's been a while since our last Newsletter, but that doesn't mean the Historical Society has been inactive. Indeed, during this "quiet" time, the DLNHS has been building its capacity to better serve our audience and ensure the long-term preservation of our communities' historic past. We are grateful for your patience, and your steadfast support. Here are a few things you've made possible:

- We've hired our Executive Director who has been re-organizing our infrastructure, developing new partnerships, and planning interesting programs.
- We started hosting programs at local schools. Last fall we led walking tours for all of the students at PS98. This pilot program was a great success and we hope to offer new tours and reach out to other schools in the future.
- We expanded our walking tours. In the last year we have participated in Open House New York and
  explored the hidden waterways of the area with Sergey Kadinsky. We will be participating in OHNY
  again this year on Sunday, October 15th, with our partners the Douglaston Local Development
  Corporation and the newly-founded Douglas House Trust.
- We've been addressing the weeping beech tree. Many of you donated so generously to replace the
  dying tree, only to watch as it came back to life! We have budgeted for its replacement should it be
  needed, and in the meantime are working with other area organizations to determine the best course
  of action for the future.
- We're making our archive more accessible because so many of you write to us with your questions.
   To that end, we are currently negotiating transferring our extensive archive to the Queens Public Library and we are seeking funds to digitize the collection to make it even more accessible.
- We've continued to highlight important places and residents with signage, the most recent being at Catharine Turner Richardson Park.
- We've organized several historic photo exhibitions at the Douglaston/Little Neck Library.
- We're working with several local partners, including the Douglaston Local Development Corporation, the Douglas Manor Association, and the Douglas Manor Environmental Association.
- We fought for the designation of the Douglaston Historic District Extension at the south end
  of Douglaston Parkway. While this time around we were not successful, our campaign to keep the
  Extension calendared gained the attention of local officials, who are helping us to try once more.
- We are trying to make navigating the landmarking process easier. If you live in a designated district, you may not realize that the DLNHS is an excellent source of help if you are trying to get Landmarks Commission approvals. We are here to answer questions and provide advice. All free of charge.

This flurry of activity does not come without cost. We will be hosting a Gala on February 10, 2018, and hope you will mark your calendars now. Please join us and continue your support of the DLNHS.


