

Gregory Dietrich Bio

Gregory Dietrich is a long-time resident of Morningside Heights, who also has been involved in efforts to preserve the neighborhood since 2009. A graduate of Columbia University's Historic Preservation and Real Estate Development programs, he has been working in the field of Historic Preservation for over nineteen years. Having worked in both the public and private sectors, he served as the Acting Director of the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission's Historic Preservation Grant Program between 1999 and 2000 before joining Cultural Resource Consulting Group (CRCG) in 2002, where he managed the New York office between 2004 and 2009. At CRCG, Gregory was a project manager and principal investigator on a myriad of cultural resource studies, while also serving as the company's Director of Historic Preservation. In 2009 he established Gregory Dietrich Preservation Consulting, where his work has entailed historic architectural and landscape studies, designation reports, historic tax credit applications, and grant writing. In addition to consulting, he has served as an adjunct instructor at the Fashion Institute of Technology (FIT) since 2008, and is currently teaching a seminar entitled "Case Studies in Historic Preservation" within New York University's Art History, Urban Design and Architecture Studies Department. In addition to teaching, he has served as a guest lecturer, panelist, and tour guide for a range of educational, cultural, and civic institutions both here and abroad.
